

## **Schizotypal Ambivalence Scale Raulin (1985) Unpublished Scale**

The following is a revision of the Intense Ambivalence Scale (Raulin, 1984). This revised scale was based on information obtained from an item analysis of the original scale. Items that were effective in discriminating, not only schizophrenics from normals but also schizophrenics from depressed patients, were retained. Seven additional items were added that seemed to have the same character as the effective items. The items marked with a "a" were part of the original Intense Ambivalence Scale.

Item	Key	
1.*	True	Often I feel like I hate even my favorite activities.
2.	True	My thoughts and- feelings always seem to be contradictory.
3.	True	My feelings about my own worth as a person are constantly changing back and forth.
4.	True	Very often when I feel like doing something, at the same time I don't feel like doing it.
5.	True	When I am trying to make a decision, it almost feels like I am physically switching from side to side.
6.	True	It's impossible to know how you feel because the people around you are constantly changing.
7*	True	I always seem to be the most unsure of myself at the same time that I am most confident of myself.
8.	True	I always seem to have difficulty deciding what I would like to do.
9.	True	Most people seem to know what they're feeling more easily than I do.
10.*	True	Love and hate tend to go together.
11.*	True	Love never seems to last very long.
12.*	True	The closer I get to people, the more I am annoyed by their faults.
13.*	True	Everyone has a lot of hidden resentment toward his loved ones.
14.*	True	I have noticed that feelings of tenderness often turn into feelings of anger.
15.*	True	My experiences with love have always been muddled with great frustrations.
16.*	True	I usually find that feelings of hate will interfere when I have grown to love someone.
17.*	True	A sense of shame has often interfered with my accepting words of praise from others.
18.*	True	I usually experience doubt when I have accomplished something that I have worked on for a long time.
19.*	True	I doubt if I can ever be sure exactly what my true interests are.
